This involves engagement with senior industry leaders and representing the Government at security industry events and on Industry Executive Boards. Working in partnership with other departments, foreign governments and a wide range of partners within the security community and beyond, the Director will identify and develop security export opportunities in key markets overseas and maximise the security legacy of the 2012 Olympic Games.

He will also be responsible for learning from security industry feedback to improve government procurement of security products and develop the options set out in the White Paper: National Security Through Technology to further support the UK security industry.
